INTRODUCTION

Pacific Northwest University of Health Sciences (PNWU), a health care focused non-profit university located in Yakima, Washington, was founded in 2005. PNWU's College of Osteopathic Medicine (COM) has a mission to educate and train students to become osteopathic physicians that provide research-driven quality care to communities of the Northwest, particularly in rural and medically underserved populations.

An essential aspect of the College's mission is the placement of all graduates into residency training programs of their choice. Medical students graduating from PNWU-COM can select the match systems in which they participate NRMP or military.

PNWU-COM Department of Graduate Medical Education (GME) supports residency programs, sponsoring institutions, and rural training tracks primarily in the PNWU-COM six-state region of WA, WY, AK, MT, ID, and OR. The Department of GME assists these programs with Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) requirements, osteopathic recognition, scholarly activity, program director development, and more. Through collaborations with [WWAMI Family Medicine Residency Network](#), the [Rural Training Track Collaborative](#), and other regional institutions/networks, the Department of GME works to establish, maintain, and grow residency placement opportunities for PNWU-COM students, as well as, provide a continuum of medical education that promotes osteopathic principles and practice for UGME and GME.

REPORT METHODOLOGY

PNWU-COM's GME Accountability Report is prepared in compliance with the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA) Standard 10. The retrospective data is based on information reported by the COM in the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine (AACOM) Annual Report, demonstrating that the COM's mission and objectives are being met. Number of graduates entering GME from the Class of 2020

Data were tabulated from enrollment in the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS), the National Board of Osteopathic Medical Examination (NBOME), and the PNWU Registrar. A student was considered in the Class of 2020 category if they registered with ERAS, had passed or were scheduled to receive scores for all COMLEX exam requirements prior to June 2020, and the Registrar affirmed them as graduating by July 1.

Historic 3-year match system data:

Final placement numbers by match systems

This data was calculated from the official match reports generated by match systems, including the Supplemental Offer and Acceptance Program (SOAP) reports from the NRMP match system, and the list of all applicant matches from the National Matching Services system. These data were later affirmed by each student as part of the preparation of the official residency match list database, as well as, the Commencement Program. These data also illustrate the percentage of match participation by system.

Number and percentage of eligible students unsuccessful in the match systems

These values were calculated by subtracting the roster totals of the final placement numbers from the number of graduates entering GME.

Note: Match data was calculated by PNWU's Office of Institutional Effectiveness with raw data provided by PNWU-COM's Department of Student Affairs.

2020 Residency Program Choices

As confirmed by the criteria above, the list of matched programs is organized alphabetically by discipline, residency program name, city, and state provided. The program names listed reflect the ACGME listing.

GME OUTCOMES

Number of PNWU graduates entering GME in 2020

- 146 students applied for GME positions in 2020; of that, 138 students were from the Class of 2020
