

PNWU offers ongoing educational programs and campaigns to promote the awareness of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking as described in the policy “Crime Prevention and Awareness Programs for Students and Employees.” These programs all share the same common theme to encourage students and employees to be aware of their responsibility for their own security and the security of others.

New employees and all PNWU students are informed during orientation that any dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and/or stalking are violations of PNWU’s policy and are **prohibited**.

A list of the research-based and outcomes oriented crime prevention and awareness programs PNWU offers:

Program	Description	Offered
Sexual Assault Prevention for Graduate Students	PNWU requires all students to participate in Title IX training each year. The incoming students will complete “ <i>Sexual Assault Prevention for Graduate Students</i> .” Continuing students complete “ <i>Sexual Assault Prevention Ongoing Education</i> ” through EVERFI. This course provides sexual assault and sexual harassment training carefully tailored to the unique needs of students. It uses life-like interactions and innovative content to develop students’ bystander knowledge of safe and positive intervention strategies.	Orientation
LawRoom	PNWU uses LawRoom to promote awareness and as a primary and ongoing prevention program for dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking.	Orientation
Catalogs and Handbooks	In addition to LawRoom, students and employees receive training and instruction during orientation as well as written educational material in applicable catalogs and handbooks.	Orientation and ongoing
Primary prevention and awareness tips	Educational programming consists of primary prevention and awareness tips which are presented at student and new employee orientation as well as posted on our Security website.	Ongoing
Present crime prevention awareness sessions	Periodically during the academic year, PNWU Safety and Security Department, in cooperation with other Law Enforcement agencies, present crime prevention awareness sessions on sexual assault, theft and vandalism, as well as educational sessions on personal safety and home security.	Throughout the school year
Crime Prevention Programs on Sexual Assault Prevention and other items	Crime Prevention Programs on personal safety, theft prevention and prevention of sexual assault are also presented by the Safety Department every year during orientation, and then reiterated throughout the year through “Timely Warning” emails. These warnings advise or warn of crime trends within the campus neighborhood. Included in these notifications are Crime Prevention Tips which promotes safety and provides tips on risk reduction so that our students and employees may recognize	Orientation and Timely Warnings throughout the year.
