Graduate Medical Education Accountability Report

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INTRODUCTION

Pacific Northwest University of Health Sciences (PNWU), a health care focused nonprofit university located in Yakima, Washington, was founded in 2005. PNWU's College of Osteopathic Medicine (COM) has a mission to educate and train students to become health care professionals with osteopathic values, and conduct research to provide quality care to communities of the Pacific Northwest, particularly rural and medically underserved populations.

The primary teaching goal at PNWU-COM is to provide a learner-centered curriculum that prepares students for graduate medical education and osteopathic clinical service. An essential aspect of the College's mission is the placement of all graduates into residency training programs of their choice. Medical students graduating from PNWU-COM can select the match systems in which they participate: military or civilian, osteopathic or allopathic.

In July 2013, PNWU affiliated with the Osteopathic Postdoctoral Training Institute, OPTI-West Educational Consortium. OPTI-West is a private, not-for-profit, western states regional consortium of osteopathic postgraduate medical education programs headquartered at Western University of Health Science, College of Osteopathic Medicine of the Pacific, in Pomona, California. It is a vibrant, growing organization composed of five medical schools and over twenty training hospitals and community partners. OPTI-West is dedicated to and responsible for promoting and maintaining the highest excellence in postgraduate medical education in member residency programs.

PNWU-COM's Department of Postdoctoral Education has prepared the following report to present a summary of graduate medical education (GME) outcomes for the graduating class of **2015**.

COCA Standard 8.3

The COM must develop a retrospective GME Accountability Report based on information reported by the COM on the AACOM Annual Report, demonstrating that the COM's mission and objectives are being met. The methods used to develop the report must be fully described and documented. The report must demonstrate the number of graduates entering GME, the positions available in the COM's affiliated OPTI, the historic percentage of match participation, final placement, the number/percentage of eligible students unsuccessful in the matches, and the residency choices of its graduates.

Guideline: COMs should strive to place 100% of their graduates into GME programs and devote the necessary resources to obtain that goal. At a minimum, this retrospective data should demonstrate a 3-year rolling average final placement rate of 98% for those students eligible and participating who entered the AOA, NRMP, or military, etc. matches.

REPORT METHODOLOGY

PNWU-COM's GME Accountability Report is prepared in compliance with the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA) Standard 8.3. The retrospective data is based on information reported by the COM in the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine (AACOM) Annual Report, demonstrating that the COM's mission and objectives are being met. The report is distributed to PNWU faculty, staff, and students, and is publicly posted on PNWU's website, PNWU.edu.

This report presents the following data for Academic Year (AY) 2014-15:

- Number of graduates entering GME from the class of 2015
- Historic 3-year data:
 - Final placement numbers by match systems
 - Number and percentage of eligible students unsuccessful in match systems
- Class of 2015 residency program matches

Number of graduates entering GME from the class of 2015

Data were tabulated from enrollment in the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS), the National Board of Osteopathic Medical Examination (NBOME), and the PNWU Registrar. A student was considered in this category if they registered with ERAS, had passed or was scheduled to receive scores for all COMLEX exam requirements prior to June 2015, and the Registrar affirmed them as graduating by July 1.

Historic 3-year match system data:

Final placement numbers by match systems

This was calculated from the official match reports generated by the match systems, including the Supplemental Offer and Acceptance Program (SOAP) reports from the NRMP match system, and the list of all applicant matches from the National Matching Services system. These data were later affirmed by each student as part of the preparation of the official residency match list database as well as the Commencement Program. This data also illustrates the percentage of match participation by system.

<u>Number and percentage of eligible students unsuccessful in the match systems</u> These values were calculated by subtracting the roster totals of the final

placement numbers from the number of graduates entering GME.

Note: Match data was calculated by PNWU's Office of Institutional Effectiveness with raw data provided by PNWU-COM's Department of Student Affairs.

Residency program choices of the 2015 graduates

As confirmed by the criteria above, the list of matched programs is organized alphabetically by discipline, with match system, residency program name, city, and state provided. The program names listed reflect the accrediting agency listing as posted by the AOA on Opportunities (opportunities.osteopathic.org/index.htm) and the ACGME (acgme.org/acgmeweb/).

OGME-1 Residency positions available in OPTI-West Educational Consortium

The number of AOA-approved first postdoctoral year of training (OGME-1) positions was tabulated from the published listing of AOA-verified positions for OPTI-West programs

on www.opportunities.osteopathic.org. A single table with medical discipline, program name, and affiliated college of osteopathic medicine is provided.

Note: This data was tabulated by OPTI-West's Chief Academic Officer. Dermatology positions excluded from total calculation (OGME-2 positions).
