PNWU is pleased to offer a variety of Continuing Medical Education (CME) opportunities for Clinical Faculty and preceptors. Additional information can be found in Osteopathic Precepting of PNWU Medical Students.

What category of CME does PNWU offer for precepting? Is this CME different for DOs than for MDs?

Certificates for precepting PNWU students are provided quarterly to those who have taught in that quarter's reporting cycle

Category 1-B credit is offered on the certificate, with one unit of credit for every hour of precepting.

CME credit received by MDs is dependent upon the rules of their ABMS specialty. It could be AMA Cat 1 or 2. It is listed as 1-B on the certificate.

How and to whom (e.g., AOA, directly to preceptor, etc.) are precepting CME hours reported?

PNWU provides a certificate with the completed hours to all credentialed Clinical Faculty. MDs self-report credits to their specific board. PNWU submits the hours for the DOs to the AOA if the physician has provided their AOA number on their faculty application.

What category of CME is PNWU accredited to offer for live presentations made to targeted audiences (e.g., faculty development)?

Participants who join live presentations (including those delivered virtually) generally receive 1-A credit, if they choose to claim credits for participation.

What category of CME is PNWU accredited to offer for asynchronous educational events (e.g., modules posted online)?

These are considered enduring materials and engaging with this material merits Category 1-A credit.
